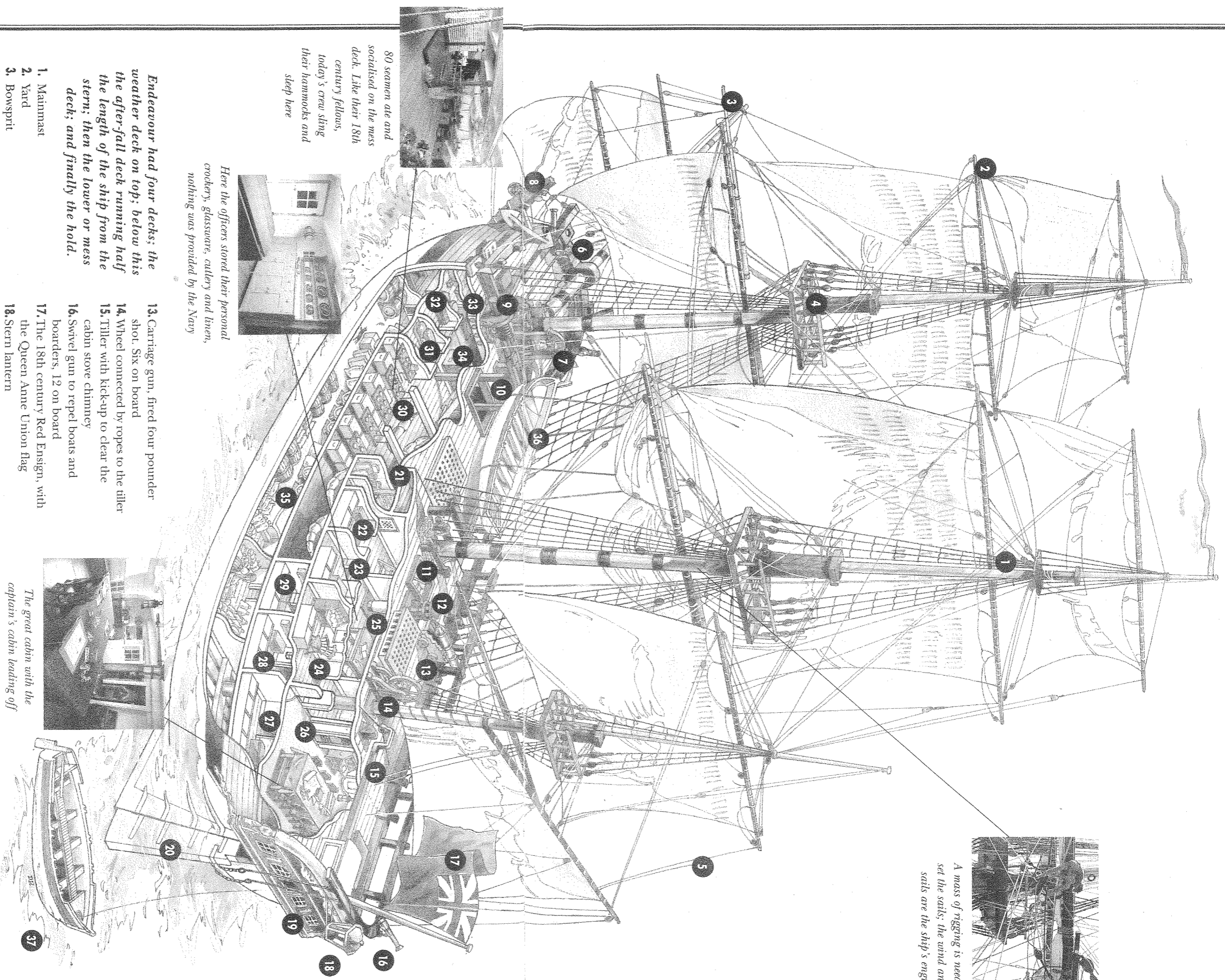


A mass of rigging is needed to set the sails; the wind and the sails are the ship's engines



80 seamen ate and socialised on the mess deck. Like their 18th century fellows, today's crew sling their hammocks and sleep here

Here the officers stored their personal crockery, glassware, cutlery and linen; nothing was provided by the Navy

Endeavour had four decks; the weather deck on top; below this the after-fall deck running half the length of the ship from the stern; then the lower or mess deck; and finally the hold.

1. Mainmast
2. Yard
3. Bowsprit
4. Tops
5. Blocks
6. Seats of ease - two wooden lavatories for the seamen
7. Ship's bell marks the rhythm of shipboard life
8. Best bower anchor
9. Windlass used to raise and lower the anchors
10. Companion (ladder) to lower deck
11. Companion to after fall deck
12. Capstan, a winch to move heavy gear and the ship in anchorage

13. Carriage gun, fired four pounder shot. Six on board
14. Wheel connected by ropes to the tiller
15. Tiller with kick-up to clear the cabin stove chimney
16. Swivel gun to repel boats and boarders, 12 on board
17. The 18th century Red Ensign, with the Queen Anne Union flag
18. Stern lantern
19. Stern windows
20. Rudder, connected by chains and ropes to the tiller
21. Pantry stored provisions for the people on the after-fall deck
22. The naturalist's cabin, Dr Daniel Carl Solander
23. The artists' cabin, Sydney Parkinson & Alexander Buchan
24. The captain's cabin, 1st Lieutenant James Cook
25. Officer's mess where they ate, relaxed and worked on their journals

26. Great Cabin where the captain and the naturalists ate and worked
27. The 2nd Lieutenant's cabin, Zachary Hicks
28. The surgeon's cabin, William Brougham Munkhouse
29. The gunner's cabin, Stephen Forward
30. The crew's mess deck with swinging tables and hammocks

31. Sail room
32. The boatswain's cabin, John Gathrey
33. Boatswain's storeroom
34. Firehearth (stove) all the ship's meals were cooked here
35. The hold where all the supplies needed for the journey were stored
36. Longboat, the heaviest of the ship's boats
37. Pinnacle, used for scouting forays
